Trophy Day Porritt Stadium, 16th February 2025

The 100m was full on with sprinters coming from their compulsory field events. The most hilarious of events the 60m now open to sprinters and throwers as the throwers have to do a track event. Brenda Davis ran really well, hopefully no injuries from all that power. Liaini Inivale's short legs lasted the distance, Marcia Black flew out in front of Sheryl and Chrissie Waring. I think it was a good idea to mix up sprinters and throwers making the timing easier. Stewart was challenged with starting the Throwers on their wobbly legs. Sarah Hockley ran a strong 200m alongside Kerry Rattray. Jenny Gater flew around the 400m to take the Woodhead Trophy from Karen Hulena. Stephen TeWhaiti was back on the track after two years making his blocks rattle and fly the javelin across the field. Matt Parsonage flew around the 1500m making it look like a sprint.

A few words from the Athletes that tried to defy gravity. We started with High Jump. The drizzle stopped but the wind didn't but that didn't deter us. All were winners in our respective age groups. Karen Hulena and Annette Hermans had a close battle in the W60 and W65. Junior Lupena M40 dashed over from the Hammer to surprise himself clearing 1.30 between throws. Stephen Te Whaiti M60 hadn't jumped for two years but there was no loss of his 'leg springs' as he absolutely flew over 1.45m doing the scissors before retiring in case he tore anything he shouldn't. Aaron Ross M45 and Iain Rattray M45 battled the wind and both cleared 1.50m before leaving to run the 60m and the momentum was lost.

In the Triple Jump the wind was a help rather than a hindrance Aaron Ross M45 and Stephen Burden M65 had a battle between the ages that ended up with little more than a hop, step and jump with Stephen edging out Aaron by 5cms.

Luckily the rain held off and the clouds kept the heat away. In the field the numbers were high which meant we split the men from the ladies, with the men getting started on the Weight Throw while the ladies went down to the Hammer. Always great to see our Auckland Athletes come down for this event. I saw some new faces in the throwing circle. Both Brenda and Tania have gone up an age group and they were throwing up to their record distances. A lot of nervous throwers lined up for their 60m sprint. My heat had Sheryl and Chrissie, I was trying to convince myself it was an honour and a privilege to run against such class.

A challenging day for Murray dealing with technology issues and still managing to get some results out on the day. Numbers were up slightly from last year.

Thanks to everyone who helped out on the day especially those of you who had been busy the day before at the Porritt Classic, and as always a great afternoon tea with some Porritt Classic left overs.



WBOP Championships Tauranga 22-23 February 2025

On the track it was great to see lots of Masters Athletes competing and Officiating at the WBOP Championships. Notably our three newest members, Annemarie McDonald in the sprints, relays and throws, Kerry Rattray in the hammer and trying out the weight throw for the first time and Jenny Gater showing some great pace in the 800m. On the track we had some good sprinting with Bruce Alexander and Iain Rattray having a tight race in the 100m and 200m, disclaimers that Bruce was very broken. Mark Cornaga and Bruce Solomon had a closer race just behind them with the younger Mark getting just in front by 0.096. Annemarie had a great 100m and 200m coming back from a slight calf niggle a couple of weeks earlier, so good that she also helped the Hawks in the 4x100m and 4x400m. Sarah Hockley also ran a great 200m and 800m backing up those from the 1500m the day before. Sarah was busy in all of the throws, but only helping the officials with the weight throw.

On the day we started the competition with the 400m, with a great battle between Iain and Mark down the home straight, which was closely followed by another battle in the discus cage, not something recommended after running a 400m! Bruce showed the younger Masters how it was done and threw an impressive 37.50m.

The 1500m was another great race with Matt Parsonage dipping under 4.30 with Malcolm Smith and Craig Holmes not far behind. Later Ben Ruthe ran in the senior race breaking the NZM45 age group record in 4.10.80.

The Sunday morning before the full heat of the day hit, Matt was out again in the 5000m and had an impressive run out front by himself coming home in 16.27. The other battle was between the Smiths, Malcolm finishing in 18.41 and Gavin in 23.47, you'll need to get the age calculator out to see who won that one. After the 200m we had the 800m races Jenny ran nice even splits for a 2.23 and Sarah 3.17. Mark and Matt had a great tussle down the home straight with both being relatively happy with times in the 2.14's. Iain ran the 600m pacing, then decided to finish with Malcolm closing in fast from behind. Craig was there too but may have pulled something on the first lap.

The rest of the day was filled with throws, the Weight Throw had a few newbies with Darryl Conn inventing a new technique. Iain was finding the holes in the cage and keeping the Officials on their toes and a comeback from Kevin Bradley who had the longest throw of the day of 13.57, with an eye on the Nationals at the end of the month. All in all a good weekend, numbers overall seemed a bit low for the WBOP Champs, hopefully just because NZ Nationals Champs are only two weeks away in Dunedin, great to see the Masters competing otherwise it would have been a very quiet weekend.


Meanwhile out in the field Tauranga really put the weather on this year with two days of brilliant sunshine with plenty of sunscreen and plenty of hydration being needed over the two days.

Great numbers were present for all the throwing events with a decent contingent from the Whakatane Athletics and Harriers - five athletes in a mixture of the Masters age groups and two in the younger age groups, Riley Savage competing in the U18 and Oliver Ashburn in the open grade.

It is always a little daunting competing alongside open age groups but for most part they seemed to tolerate our participation, hopefully we are an inspiration that they can continue throwing into their twilight years as well. I like to think we showed them that age is no barrier.

For our newer throwers, this was a good opportunity to get some cage work in before the Nationals at the end of March. Plenty of advice and tips flowing saw some decent performances with some PB's gained and a few records thrown in there as well with the steel tape coming out to play on a couple of occasions and as an A grade official, I was kept busy signing off not only Masters records but Para athletes records! I thought I had broken a record but then remembered it wasn't Trophy day distance I was trying to beat but a record set by Bev Savage that has eluded me yet again. One day Bev, one day!

The medals are always a bonus and it was great to see a podium out there for everyone to use to receive their medals and have photos taken. The only down side of the weekend was the lack of shade on the Sunday as unfortunately the gazebo's had been taken down the day before and not put up again which is a shame as they were definitely needed both days. Thanks to the Tauranga club for a well-run competition.
