NZ Indoor Champs Hastings 16-17th August 2025

Friday was a beautiful sunny day just perfect for a drive to Hastings with a cuppa at Taupo meeting up with Trevor and Henare. We stayed at the Hostel again with a good number of other Athletes including Brenda, Rachael and Bruce. Holly Robinson was staying there getting some competition in before heading off to India in a few weeks for their World Comp and she shared with us how she was transitioning from Javelin to Shot due to her elbow injuries. Lisa Adams also threw the shot as part of her prep for this same competition. Both of these ladies had amazing throws, Holly 12.18 and Lisa 13.20. I had a quick catch up with a few of our WBOP Athletes and here's what they had to say.

Sheryl Gower has been training twice a week at Porritt, she had a PB with her shot. Her 50m was 9.44 and considering her poor start she was happy with that time. Trevor Watson has increased his training this year. He got silver in the 50m the same as last year and enjoyed the Trans Tasman rivalry with Daryl Ellis. His first race was just one second better than the second race. Henare Vickeridge was at his first ever Indoor Champs and has been training during the winter so thought he might as well give this as go as it was his first sprint in ages and he was quicker than expected. Rachael Savage was at her first Indoors. She has had to restrict her training and entered the Shot, 60m and triple jump with limitations. She managed a PB in the Triple Jump, her shot was adequate considering and for the 60m she was just participating. She thinks she is the best chauffeur Brenda Davis has ever had. Brenda Davis has been focusing on weight training every second day. She broke the record in the Shot and ran her first ever indoor 50m surprising herself with a quick time. Bruce Alexander had come all the way from Whitianga to his first ever Indoor Champs and was coming off a back injury that he hurt last year. So with six weeks training and limited distance it was great to have a winter competition which fits. 
